The Computer Crime Institute has assisted our office and many other Utah Law Enforcement departments with the recovery of critical cell phone evidence that has been instrumental in the charging or prosecuting of criminal activities.

Previously cell phone evidence was viewed primarily as supporting evidence, or evidence used to further an investigation.
